□ (Academic) Transcript / Qualifications

_____ : It can also be referred to as an academic record. It should list all the modules or subjects you studied in each year, the marks or grades you achieved for each module and the credit value and level of each module.

_____ : Degrees, diplomas, certificates, professional titles and so forth that an individual has acquired.

::: CERTIFICATE, DIPLOMA (HND) or DEGREE :::

It usually implies that you have gained a basic level of higher education knowledge and skills. It can also be related to self-enrichment or hobbyist purposes

It is a vocational qualification, usually a little more intensive and detailed than certificate programs and may take longer to complete. After it, you can either enroll for a degree course or look for a job

Qualification awarded to students upon successful completion of a course of study in higher education, usually at a college or university. The most common is the Bachelor's Degree
